DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Let's take  
roll-call then. Kim Marinello.

MEMBER MARINELLO: Here.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Greg Haas.

MEMBER HAAS: Here.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Doug Preisse.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Yes.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We have a quorum.

I am looking for the approval of minutes.  
We sent out the approval -- the minutes to the Board  
Members, and we have four sets. I have them here if  
anybody wants to look at them. Otherwise I'll --

MS. BROWN: Three sets.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Three sets? I've  
got four.

MS. BROWN: Oh, okay. What do I have  
over there?

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: There's four  
mentioned.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: And I have got  
four here.

1                   MEMBER MARINELLO: I move that the Board  
2 approve the minutes of the November 17, 2016,  
3 meeting; the November 21, 2016, meeting; the  
4 November 22, 2016, meeting; and the November 23,  
5 2016, meeting of the Franklin County Board of  
6 Elections as submitted.

7                   MEMBER HAAS: Second.

8                   DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
9 favor signify by saying aye.

10                   All those opposed. Motion carries.

11                   The certification of candidates, I  
12 believe we have a certification of candidates to the  
13 May 2 ballot, the November 7 ballot, and then we will  
14 have to certify those issues and local options.

15                   So, Jeff Mackey, you want to tell the  
16 Board Members what we're doing?

17                   MR. MACKEY: We received petitions from  
18 53 candidates and also received 8 local option  
19 filings. Staff checked about 18,500 signatures and  
20 reviewed the petitions and found all of them to be  
21 valid and sufficient.

22                   I have got a couple of exhibits there for  
23 you. The first exhibit is Exhibit A that contains  
24 the list of candidates we do have to appear at the

1 Primary Election. It's made up of Columbus City  
2 Council. There were 10 candidates for three seats so  
3 six will be nominated there. Columbus Board of  
4 Education had eight candidates for three seats, so  
5 six will be nominated there. Hilliard City Council  
6 is Republican only. They had five candidates for  
7 four seats, so they will nominate four Republican  
8 candidates to appear at the General. Reynoldsburg  
9 City Council has Democrat and Republican Primaries.  
10 Democrats had five candidates for the three seats,  
11 and the Republicans had four, so they will each  
12 nominate three candidates to move on to the General.  
13 Whitehall City Council is nonpartisan like Columbus,  
14 and only Ward 1 had more candidates than are -- that  
15 would trigger the Primary. So Wards 2 and 3 will go  
16 on to the General.

17 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Does that  
18 conclude your report?

19 MR. MACKEY: That's a summary of Exhibit  
20 A.

21 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Yeah, Exhibit A.

22 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: You are saying there  
23 were 53 candidates filed and all 53 qualified?

24 MR. MACKEY: That's a good percentage

1 this time.

2 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: That would be what  
3 percentage?

4 MR. MACKEY: 100 percent.

5 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: That's sort of  
6 surprising but, you know.

7 MEMBER HAAS: I move that the Board  
8 certify to the May 2, 2017, Primary Election ballot  
9 those candidates listed on Exhibit A and that these  
10 petitions were filed timely and found to be valid and  
11 sufficient.

12 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

13 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
14 favor signify by saying aye.

15 All opposed same sign. Motion carries.

16 What about Exhibit B for the November  
17 election?

18 MR. MACKEY: Exhibit B will be candidates  
19 we will certify through to the November General  
20 Election including Municipal Court candidates for  
21 judge and clerk, Columbus City Attorney and City  
22 Auditor. Hilliard Democratic candidates didn't have  
23 enough to trigger the Primary. Reynoldsburg City  
24 Auditor --

1 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: What did you say about  
2 Hilliard?

3 MR. MACKEY: Hilliard had Democratic  
4 candidates but there weren't enough to trigger the  
5 Primary.

6 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I see.

7 MR. MACKEY: They get to ride through to  
8 the General Election and as well as Reynoldsburg City  
9 Auditor, Whitehall City Auditor and City Council  
10 Wards 2 through 4.

11 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay.

12 MEMBER MARINELLO: I move that the Board  
13 certify to the November 7, 2017, General Election  
14 ballot those candidates listed on Exhibit B and that  
15 these petitions were filed timely and found to be  
16 valid and sufficient.

17 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

18 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
19 favor signify by saying aye.

20 All opposed. Motion carries.

21 And then finally certification of issues  
22 and local options.

23 MR. MACKEY: On Exhibit C we had the  
24 three questions, the one countywide question for

1 senior services levy, Reynoldsburg income tax  
2 question, and a Franklin Township police levy; and  
3 then we had eight local options. A couple of those  
4 local options had two questions contained in them.  
5 That's why it looks like more than eight but there's  
6 only eight.

7 MEMBER HAAS: I move that the Board  
8 certify to the May 2, 2017, Primary Election ballot  
9 those issues and local options listed on Exhibit C  
10 and that these issues and local options were filed  
11 timely and found to be valid and sufficient.

12 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

13 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
14 favor signify by saying aye.

15 All those opposed same sign. The motion  
16 carries.

17 The next item on here is for -- thanks,  
18 Jeff -- is for just discussion only. It involves  
19 Board Member pay raise. In 2015 the legislature  
20 passed a pay raise for 2016 of 5 percent and to carry  
21 over into 2017 a 5 percent. So we just wanted to let  
22 you know that you will be receiving that, and I think  
23 there's some --

24 DIRECTOR LEONARD: The adjustment issue

1 is that the 2016 pay raise began -- statutorily began  
2 at the beginning of the year. It was not implemented  
3 for Board Members until mid June, late June so but  
4 unfortunately apparently no retro -- retroactive pay  
5 to the beginning of 2016 was done. And so that's  
6 being accounted for at this time.

7 So in addition to seeing a short retro  
8 pay for the first three pay periods of 2017, you will  
9 also see that you are being given an additional  
10 amount that is the retro pay for the period from  
11 January 1 of 2016 to June 26 of 2016. And that was  
12 beginning June 26. That was when the Board Members  
13 started seeing that 2016 increase in their -- in  
14 their pay. So there's a retro to be done to make up  
15 for that error that occurred in 2016.

16 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Spend your  
17 newfound wealth wisely.

18 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Thank you for that.

19 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Full-time  
20 employee pay raise on the agenda and that does  
21 require Board action. The Franklin County  
22 Commissioners approved a 2 percent pay raise across  
23 the board for county employees. And we believe  
24 our -- it's been budgeted. We believe our

1 employees -- our full-time employees are -- they've  
2 done a great job, and we would like to see the Board  
3 pass that.

4 DIRECTOR LEONARD: Right. Again, it's --  
5 it was appropriated to the Board of Elections, and I  
6 guess my understanding it has been past practice to  
7 allocate it across the board as well.

8 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: That seems right to  
9 me.

10 MEMBER HAAS: I move that the Board  
11 accept the supplemental appropriation from the  
12 Franklin County Commissioners for a 2 percent pay  
13 increase for non-bargaining employees of the Board of  
14 Elections and that this pay increase be made  
15 retroactive to the pay period beginning December 26,  
16 2016.

17 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

18 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
19 favor signify by saying aye.

20 All those opposed same sign. Motion  
21 carries.

22 I believe we also put in an Excel  
23 spreadsheet that showed the employees and what  
24 they -- what they make now and what they will

1 currently make -- what they will make with the  
2 addition of the 2 percent pay raise.

3 The next item on the agenda is the E.E.  
4 Ward contract extension. As you are probably aware,  
5 E.E. Ward is the vendor that transports our voting  
6 machines to and from the 378 polling locations. And  
7 this is a contract extension. Basically we pay them  
8 \$27.50 a machine to -- not a machine, a crate of  
9 machines.

10 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: They have done the  
11 work for years and years and years.

12 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: They have and  
13 we've -- when we set this out to bid, there was  
14 another company that was lower and they gave it a  
15 shot and soon realized it wasn't something they can  
16 handle and we ended up going with E.E. Ward and they  
17 have been a fantastic partner, so we would like to  
18 see that continued.

19 MEMBER HAAS: I move that the Board renew  
20 the contract of E.E. Ward Moving & Storage Company  
21 for pickup and delivery of voting machines in an  
22 amount not to exceed \$90,000 in calendar year 2017.

23 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

24 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in

1 favor signify by saying aye.

2 All those opposed same sign. Motion  
3 carries.

4 The EMCS contract, which is the Election  
5 Management Consulting Services, that's for services  
6 of software and upgrades to our integrity voting  
7 database. I believe that went up this year by, was  
8 it, 5 percent, Director, that's in the contract?

9 DIRECTOR LEONARD: Correct, 5 percent.

10 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: And we would pay  
11 them on a quarterly basis. I think they have done a  
12 good job for us; and frankly, you know, at this point  
13 I think we have to have them, so. Not to exceed  
14 \$57,000 for the calendar year 2017.

15 DIRECTOR LEONARD: The contract also  
16 provides for a one-year renewal for 2018, so if the  
17 Board -- with the price for that extra year fixed  
18 already. So if the Board chooses in 2018 to exercise  
19 that option, then we have the option to keep them on  
20 with a price that's been determined already so.

21 MEMBER HAAS: I move that the Board  
22 contract with EMCS for software upgrades and support  
23 of the integrity voter system in an amount not to  
24 exceed \$57,000 in calendar year 2017.

1 MEMBER MARINELLO: Second.

2 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
3 favor signify by saying aye.

4 All those opposed same sign. Motion  
5 carries.

6 The next items that we wanted to discuss  
7 involve employees, so I believe we probably need to  
8 go into Executive Session. Is that amenable to you  
9 folks?

10 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Well, you will know  
11 when you call the roll.

12 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I'll call the  
13 roll. Kim Marinello.

14 MEMBER MARINELLO: Yes.

15 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Greg Haas.

16 MEMBER HAAS: Yes.

17 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Doug Preisse.

18 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Yes.

19 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We're in  
20 Executive Session.

21 MEMBER HAAS: Pursuant to Ohio Revised  
22 Code 121.22(G)(1) and (3), I move that the Franklin  
23 County Board of Elections go into Executive Session  
24 to consider the appointment, employment, dismissal,

1 discipline, promotion, demotion, and/or compensation  
 2 of a public employee.

3 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Do we have a  
 4 second?

5 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

6 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I guess this is  
 7 where I should take roll. Kim Marinello.

8 MEMBER MARINELLO: Yes.

9 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Greg Haas.

10 MEMBER HAAS: Yes.

11 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Doug Preisse.

12 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Yes.

13 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion carries.

14 We are in Executive Session.

15 (Discussion off the record.)

16 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I would be  
 17 looking for a motion to exit Executive Session.

18 MEMBER MARINELLO: I move that the  
 19 Franklin County Board of Elections adjourn from  
 20 Executive Session and that no votes or official  
 21 actions were taken during the Executive Session.

22 MEMBER HAAS: Second.

23 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We will have a  
 24 roll. Kim Marinello.

1 MEMBER MARINELLO: Here.

2 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Greg Haas.

3 MEMBER HAAS: Yes.

4 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: And Doug Preisse.

5 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Yes.

6 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion carries.

7 We are out of Executive Session.

8 First item on here is to talk about the  
9 Franklin County Human Resources M.O.U.

10 MEMBER HAAS: I move that the Board  
11 authorize the Director and Deputy Director to execute  
12 a Memorandum of Understanding with the Franklin  
13 County Human Resources Department not to exceed  
14 \$22,000 for the hiring of a human resources  
15 administrator.

16 MEMBER MARINELLO: Second.

17 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
18 favor signify by saying aye.

19 Those opposed same sign. Motion carries.

20 The next item on here is about the Board  
21 of Elections employee department transfer.

22 MEMBER HAAS: I move that the Franklin  
23 County Board of Elections transfer Phil Purkey from  
24 the PEO Department where he is making a salary of

1 \$55,081 per year at \$26.48 per hour to the Absentee  
2 Department where he will make a salary of \$46,009 a  
3 year/\$22.12 per hour effective with the pay period  
4 beginning February 6, 2017.

5 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

6 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
7 favor signify by saying aye.

8 All opposed same sign.

9 Any other issues or items for the Board?  
10 Seeing none, I will entertain a motion to adjourn.

11 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Move to adjourn.

12 MEMBER MARINELLO: Second.

13 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
14 favor signify by saying aye.

15 We're adjourned.

16 (Thereupon, at 2:54 p.m., the meeting was  
17 adjourned.)
