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1 P R O C E E D I N G S

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3 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The next
4 item on the agenda is paper ballot allocation for
5 the May 5 Primary Special Election. I'll call on
6 Carla Patton, Manager of Operations.

7 MEMBER FREEDHOFF: Carla, where
8 have you been all day?

9 MS. PATTON: Hiding away back in the
10 bunker.

11 Good afternoon. Before I present
12 Exhibit A, I would like to have you, if you would,
13 please, there was a missed -- one of the lines, the
14 number was inadvertently removed for the number of
15 ballots. So if you could find -- it should be
16 toward the back Washington A2 of Exhibit A.

17 DIRECTOR WHITE: Page 22.

18 MS. PATTON: Thank you, Antone.

19 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Where are we
20 looking?

21 MS. PATTON: Page 22 of Exhibit A
22 for Washington A2. If you could please write in 25
23 in both of the columns that are empty. I will be
24 correcting that electronically and resubmitting it

1 and dispersing it to you all for your records.

2 So, you have Exhibit A in front of
3 you, which is the initial paper ballot allocation
4 for the 2026 Primary Election. The Election
5 Official Manual, Chapter 5 Section 5.08, ballot
6 quantities, requires that we look at a
7 previous-like election and allocate the number of
8 provisional ballots that was cast in the
9 previous-like election for each precinct plus an
10 additional 5 percent of that number for the
11 election day ballots because we have an offer of
12 the voters of choice as to their method of voting,
13 whether it's on machines or paper. Our board has
14 the discretion upon the amount of paper ballots
15 that we allocate on Election Day.

16 So for this election, we went back
17 to the May 2022 Primary, which in turn was the most
18 similar-like election. And as a note, I did look
19 at the August 2022 Primary. If you recall, we had
20 that second primary.

21 However, the May Primary had a
22 larger turnout. So we opted to go with the May
23 Election versus the August 2022 Election.

24 So, so the allocation for the

1 Provisional and Election Day ballots are combined
2 in the allocation report before you.

3 So using the precinct results from
4 May of 2022, we calculated the Provisional ballot
5 requirement and then divided by that number by the
6 total number of ballots cast in the election for
7 that precinct.

8 That calculation gave us a
9 percentage ballot cast to add in for the
10 provisional. We also took 5 percent of that number
11 and added in. Getting the calculation, we ended up
12 with a 17 percent of the ballots cast in the
13 precinct overall for -- in the 2022 as our basis
14 for the allocation. 16 percent of that goes for
15 Election Day use. One percent of that number goes
16 for provisionals.

17 That number then was rounded up to
18 the next increment of 25. Never round down so we
19 don't short anybody. So this calculation does meet
20 the requirements as set forth in the Election
21 Official Manual.

22 I will note also you have a separate
23 column there for the Libertarian and the issues
24 only.

1 So the calculation mentioned above
2 was for the Democratic and Republican Primary
3 ballots.

4 For the Libertarian and issues only
5 ballots, we're issuing one pad of 25 for every
6 precinct or ballot style that's available.
7 Combined, there will be 39,175 ballots each for
8 Democratic and Republican Primary, and 25,400
9 ballots countywide for the Libertarian Primary, and
10 18,450 issues only ballots for the Primary as not
11 all precincts have an issues only ballot available.

12 In the event that on Election Day a
13 location is running low on ballots, they are
14 instructed to notify us when they reach a certain
15 threshold, and then at our time, we do have a
16 county print shop that is available all day to
17 print on demand any ballots that we need. Within
18 an hour, we typically have those ballots to a
19 location.

20 So we would ask that you adopt the
21 paper ballot allocation set before you in Exhibit A
22 for the 2026 Primary Election.

23 If you have any questions, I will
24 entertain those.

1 DIRECTOR WHITE: Thank you, Carla.

2 MEMBER FREEDHOFF: Thank you.

3 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. Any
4 questions?

5 MEMBER SEXTON: Carla, I just have
6 one question. What is -- I'm looking at some of
7 the allocations, and page 4, Columbus, like, 32A,
8 there's 75. 32B there's 50. I'm just talking
9 about Democrats and Republicans allocation.

10 MS. PATTON: Right.

11 MEMBER SEXTON: C is 25. So I'm
12 wondering...

13 MS. PATTON: So each of those
14 precincts is based on the turnout of 2022. So we
15 took the overall ballots cast regardless of what
16 type of ballot was and took 17 percent of that and
17 rounded it up. So each of those precincts had
18 different ballots cast, a different turnout. And
19 so that's why, you know, B would have a lower
20 turnout than what A had.

21 MEMBER SEXTON: Ones in 25 and then
22 17 percent was a turnout?

23 MS. PATTON: We took 17 percent of
24 the turnout from 2022 for that precinct, and then

1 we rounded it up.

2 So if it came down -- if that result
3 17 percent ended up with 26 as your result, that
4 was rounded up to 50 ballots.

5 DIRECTOR WHITE: Can you clarify why
6 we chose 17 percent?

7 MS. PATTON: Okay. So the
8 17 percent -- so when I calculate -- the first
9 thing I calculated is provisional. I kind of get
10 that number added in there. 15 percent is the
11 recommended -- is what's in the Election Official
12 Manual for backup ballots. And so I always use the
13 15 percent. And then because of paper by choice, I
14 typically will add at least another one percent to
15 that number to allow for paper by choice.

16 Paper by choice doesn't even come
17 close to one percent of the number of voters who
18 actually cast the ballot in that method. So it's
19 always -- and everything in the Election Official
20 Manual points to the turnout of the previous
21 election rather than the registered voters.

22 MEMBER SEXTON: So the higher --
23 based on the higher the turnout, the higher the
24 allocation?

1 MS. PATTON: Exactly.

2 DIRECTOR WHITE: Correct. So in the
3 fall, these numbers will be a lot higher.

4 MS. PATTON: Yes. You'll see higher
5 numbers in November always.

6 MEMBER SEXTON: Okay. Thank you.

7 MEMBER SHUMAKER: Thank you.

8 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Super duper.

9 Okay. Other questions?

10 MEMBER SEXTON: Seeing none, Michael
11 Sexton, I move the board adopt the paper ballot
12 allocation formula in Exhibit A, compiled by the
13 board staff for the May 5, 2026 Primary Special
14 Election.

15 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I second the
16 motion.

17 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been
18 properly moved and seconded.

19 All those in favor of the motion,
20 signify by saying aye.

21 (All members of the board voted unanimously by
22 saying aye.)

23 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,
24 same sign.

1 Motion carries.

2 I'm going to ask Carla to stay up
3 there and give us an allocation for voting machine
4 and poll book.

5 MS. PATTON: Okay. Next is Exhibit
6 B. Is the initial voting equipment allocation for
7 the 2026 Primary Election. Just as a note, that
8 these allocations -- the allocations for equipment
9 are allocated on the location level versus the
10 precinct level. So that is why this report is much
11 smaller than the paper ballot allocation.

12 So if you look at Exhibit B, the
13 first column is the tabletop express votes. This
14 is the main method -- or main equipment that is
15 used by our voters to cast their ballots, also
16 known as the ballot markers.

17 Those are being allocated at one for
18 every 365 voters for this election with a location
19 receiving no less than two. That is a total of
20 2,567 tabletops.

21 The next item is the kiosk express
22 votes, which are ballot markers that cater more to
23 the ADA voter who may be in a wheelchair or someone
24 who -- it can be used for any voter, but it's

1 catered more to the ADA voter.

2 Those are allocated for one -- at
3 one for every 4,100 voters in a location with no
4 less than one being assigned to any location.
5 There are a total of 363 of those being allocated.

6 Your next column is just a
7 culmination of the total number of ballot markers
8 based on the tabletops and the kiosk.

9 Just to show that there are a total
10 of 2,930 ballot markers being accumulated
11 countywide. The DS 200 ballot counters is the
12 tabulation machines. This election, again, we have
13 one for every 2,750 voters with no less than one
14 being allocated to any location for a total of 469
15 DS 200.

16 And then, finally, the last column
17 on there is the electronic poll votes for the
18 touchpads. Those are being allocated at one for
19 every 900 voters with no less than three for any
20 location, for a total of 1,231 touchpads for this
21 election.

22 If we find on Election Day that a
23 location is busier than expected, has a longer
24 line, we do have equipment available in the

1 building here that we can get programmed and deploy
2 out to that location to help alleviate any long
3 lines or broken equipment, if that may be the case.

4 With that, we would ask that you
5 adopt the voting equipment allocation for the 2026
6 Primary Election as set forth in Exhibit B.

7 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Very well. Any
8 questions or thoughts or concerns?

9 I move that the board adopt the
10 voting machine and public allocation formula in
11 Exhibit B compiled by the board staff for the May
12 5, 2026 Primary Election.

13 MEMBER SEXTON: Michael Sexton, I'll
14 second the motion.

15 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been
16 moved and seconded. All of those in favor of the
17 motion, signify by saying aye.

18 (All members of the board voted unanimously by
19 saying aye.)

20 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,
21 same sign.

22 Motion carries.

23 The next item on the agenda --

24 DIRECTOR WHITE: Thank you, Carla.

1 MEMBER FREEDHOFF: Thank you, Carla.

2 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Next item on
3 the agenda is write-in candidates for the May 5
4 Primary Election ballot, and I'm going to turn that
5 over to Jeff Mackey, the Manager of Petitions and
6 Filings.

7 MR. MACKEY: Filing deadline for
8 write-in candidates for the May 5, 2026 Primary
9 Election was February the 23rd.

10 Staff reviewed the declarations of
11 intent to be a write-in candidate for the 28 people
12 you have listed there on Exhibit C, and found them
13 to be valid, sufficient and timely filed.

14 We, therefore, recommend them for
15 certification to the primary election ballot.

16 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. Any
17 questions?

18 MEMBER FREEDHOFF: I do not.

19 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I don't either.

20 MEMBER FREEDHOFF: Mr. Chairman,
21 Meredith Freedhoff, I move that the board certify
22 the candidates listed on Exhibit C as valid
23 write-in candidates for the office they are seeking
24 and they appear on the May 5, 2026 Primary Election

1 ballot.

2 MEMBER SHUMAKER: Jamie Shumaker, I
3 second.

4 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been
5 properly moved and seconded. All of those in favor
6 of the motion, signify by saying aye.

7 (All members of the board voted unanimously by
8 saying aye.)

9 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,
10 same sign.

11 Motion carries.

12 I'll call on Jeff again to discuss
13 the certification for candidates for the Minerva
14 Park Charter Commission.

15 MR. MACKEY: Village of Minerva Park
16 filed a resolution to place in question of whether
17 to form a Charter Commission on the May 5 Special
18 Election.

19 You already approved that in our
20 last meeting. Part of the Charter Commission
21 process includes electing members of the Charter
22 Commission should the question pass, and the filing
23 deadline for those petitions was February 17, the
24 date of our last meeting.

1 So, we didn't have those ready for
2 you then; but since then, we have reviewed the
3 petitions of the 11 candidates we have there before
4 you on Exhibit D and found them to be valid,
5 sufficient and timely filed, and we recommend them
6 for inclusion on the Special Election ballot.

7 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: All right. Any
8 questions?

9 MEMBER SEXTON: Mr. Chairman,
10 Michael Sexton, I move the board certify the
11 candidates listed on Exhibit D as valid candidates
12 for the office they are seeking and shall appear on
13 the May 5, 2026 Special Election ballot.

14 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second the
15 motion.

16 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been
17 moved and seconded. All those in favor of the
18 motion, signify by saying aye.

19 (All members of the board voted unanimously by
20 saying aye.)

21 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,
22 same sign.

23 Motion carries.

24 The next I'm on the agenda is

1 certification of City of Columbus Proposed Charter
2 Amendments and call on Jeff again.

3 MR. MACKEY: I know our friends at
4 the prosecutor's office were busy with some of your
5 earlier things. So I'm not sure if they had a
6 chance to look that one over.

7 Have you had a chance to review the
8 Columbus Proposed Charter Amendment?

9 So I don't have a recommendation
10 from them. But staff has reviewed the Charter
11 Amendment and found it to be sufficient, valid and
12 we'll ask that you...

13 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: What is this
14 amendment?

15 MR. MACKEY: It's an amendment
16 called Community Crisis Response Amendment, and it
17 deals with how the city responds to 9-1-1 calls
18 that wouldn't necessarily require police or fire
19 intervention but possibly a different level of
20 response.

21 MS. HUMMER: I will tell you that in
22 terms of the process that we know what the City of
23 Columbus goes through for charter amendments.
24 Their city attorney's office does spend a great

1 deal of time making sure all of the requirements
2 are met. We have not actually reviewed this
3 because I think it came in...

4 MR. MACKEY: Earlier this week.
5 Tuesday -- Wednesday.

6 MS. HUMMER: Tuesday or Wednesday.

7 MEMBER FREEDHOFF: So what you --
8 you can't make any recommendations?

9 MS. HUMMER: We have not reviewed
10 it. I would hate to tell you that we've reviewed
11 it when we haven't.

12 MR. MACKEY: I have strong
13 confidence that it's in good shape.

14 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Have you met Zach
15 Klein? I'm teasing. I have confidence too.

16 MEMBER SEXTON: I just had a
17 question. So there were, I guess, two amendments.
18 One that was filed, I believe, and then one that
19 was presented to us by counsel, and it's my
20 understanding that one of those has been withdrawn
21 and replaced with the other?

22 MR. MACKEY: Yes. So the citizen
23 group filed the petition earlier this year. We
24 reviewed all of those. They found that they had

1 sufficient petitions to move forward. I believe
2 the city and the group worked together recently,
3 came up with this proposal, and at the time that
4 the city filed this resolution, the petitioners had
5 withdrawn their petition with the city. So city
6 was not required to forward that issue to us.

7 MEMBER SEXTON: But this is the --

8 MS. HUMMER: Compromised.

9 MEMBER SEXTON: This is the new one
10 or the most secured version?

11 MS. HUMMER: Between the two.
12 Between the government and the group.

13 MEMBER SEXTON: Well, Mr. Chairman,
14 with that, Michael Sexton, I move the board accept
15 the City of Columbus Proposed Charter Amendment as
16 submitted and that the Proposed Charter Amendment
17 shall appear on the May 5, 2026 Special Election
18 ballot.

19 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second the
20 motion.

21 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been
22 properly moved and seconded. All of those in favor
23 of the motion, signify by saying aye.

24 (All members of the board voted unanimously by

1 saying aye.)

2 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,
3 same sign.

4 Motion carries.

5 The next item on the agenda is
6 candidate withdrawals. Jeff.

7 MR. MACKEY: You probably have a
8 couple of the documents in front of you there. On
9 February 23, we received written notice from
10 Elizabeth Richards, a Democratic Candidate for
11 State Representative in House District 2 requesting
12 to withdrawal from the ballot.

13 And on February 24, we received
14 written notice from Jack Etheridge, a Republican
15 Candidate for State Central Committee in District
16 25.

17 Also requesting to withdrawal --
18 most of those notices were received prior to the
19 date when we were no longer able to remove one name
20 from the ballot. So they would come off the
21 ballot. Just yesterday, we received a further
22 withdrawal or written notice from Mathias Manner,
23 who is a Democratic Candidate for the Judge of the
24 Court of Common Pleas in the Probate Division,

1 requesting to withdrawal. So this one has now been
2 received after the deadline, so his name would have
3 to stay on the ballot. So you'll need to take a
4 slightly different action accepting his withdrawal.

5 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. Any
6 questions? Those have been provided and suggested.
7 So that's good.

8 Jamie, how do you feel?

9 MEMBER SHUMAKER: Mr. Chairman, I,
10 Jamie Shumaker, accept the withdrawals of Elizabeth
11 Richards, a Candidate for the Democratic State
12 Representative District 2 and Lionel J. Etheridge,
13 as a Candidate for Republican State Central
14 Committee, District 25. Their names shall not
15 appear on the May 5, 2026, Primary Election ballot.

16 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second the
17 motion.

18 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been
19 properly moved and seconded.

20 All of those in favor, signify by
21 saying aye.

22 (All members of the board voted unanimously by
23 saying aye.)

24 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,

1 same sign.

2 Motion carries.

3 Now, we're taking up the withdrawal
4 of Mathias Manner.

5 MR. MACKEY: We'll post notices at
6 the voting locations and include them with the
7 absentee ballots to alert individuals that he has
8 also withdrawn even though his name is on the
9 ballot.

10 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Good. Thank you.

11 MEMBER FREEDHOFF: Any questions?

12 Chairman, Meredith Freedhoff, I move that the board
13 accept the withdrawal of -- is it Mathias? Mathias
14 Manner from the Democrat Primary for Judge of the
15 Court of Common Pleas Probate Division. Since the
16 withdrawal was received at the seventh day before
17 the election, his name will remain on the ballot.

18 MEMBER SEXTON: Chairman, Michael
19 Sexton, I'll second it.

20 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Thank you, sir.

21 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been
22 properly moved and seconded. All of those in
23 favor, signify by saying aye.

24 (All members of the board voted unanimously by

1 saying aye.)

2 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,
3 same sign.

4 Motion carries.

5 Thank you, Jeff.

6 The next item on the agenda is the
7 2026 Primary Election Traffic and Parking
8 Mitigation Plan that I believe is required for us
9 by the Secretary of State.

10 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: This better be
11 good. You've been sitting there for hours.

12 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: This is Matt
13 Kelly. He's our manager of absentee ballot
14 department.

15 MR. KELLY: Good afternoon,
16 Mr. Chairman, Members of the Board, per the
17 Secretary of State's Ohio Election Official Manual,
18 we are required to come before the board for
19 approval of a parking mitigation plan for any
20 election. The boards are encouraged to develop a
21 drive-thru ballot drop off system for periods of
22 high volume turnout, and these plans must be
23 approved by a vote of the board to meet the
24 requirements and best practices established by the

1 Secretary of State.

2 The Secretary of State established
3 best practices back in, I believe, it was 2024,
4 September, and they took our parking plan and made
5 it a directive. So I guess that's flattery and
6 that's a good thing.

7 So our parking mitigation plan for
8 this election, we decided to -- since we don't know
9 exactly how folks will approach the new absentee
10 deadline of Election Day, we anticipate more voters
11 will bring their ballots physically up to the board
12 of elections. So we are planning for that.
13 Instead of reading through the entire plan that you
14 should have in front of you, I'll just highlight a
15 few of the things we're doing.

16 Again, for that Election Day, 7:30
17 p.m. cutoff, we are anticipating a higher volume of
18 people driving up here. We would rather not have
19 them park, get out of their cars, walk into the
20 board of elections.

21 So we are moving our ballot drop off
22 tent start time up a full week. We'll be starting
23 our ballot drop off tent April 13, and that will
24 run through Election Day, and we will post those

1 hours on our website as well.

2 As part of the other parking
3 mitigation program this election, we plan to
4 enforce the 2020 voter parking only policy from the
5 board to prevent the campaign volunteers,
6 candidates, campaign vehicles from taking up voter
7 parking spots. That's the challenge in the past,
8 but I think our candidates and campaigns are
9 starting to learn where we need them to park, and
10 they're understanding that it's important that we
11 have those spaces reserved for voters.

12 We will be placing -- we have placed
13 no campaign parking and towing enforcement signs
14 throughout the parking areas. So the campaigns and
15 candidates and volunteers should know that we plan
16 on enforcing this.

17 To maximize traffic flow, we are
18 hiring a parking company to help with flagging in
19 people who are parking and flagging out people that
20 are exiting as well as directing them to our voting
21 curbside or curbside voting down at the end of the
22 building.

23 We have established that curbside
24 voting area for, I believe, six elections in a row

1 to the east end of the building. So people are now
2 learning exactly where they need to be for curbside
3 parking. So those are just some of the highlights
4 that we have in this plan, and I ask for board
5 approval or any questions -- or answer any
6 questions we have.

7 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I don't have any
8 questions.

9 MEMBER SHUMAKER: And I have no
10 questions.

11 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: So we do need a
12 vote. There are no questions. We look at the
13 appropriate motion here.

14 MEMBER SEXTON: Mr. Chairman,
15 Michael Sexton, I move the board approve the 2026
16 Primary Special Election Traffic and Parking
17 Mitigation Plan for the early vote center located
18 at 1700 Morse Road.

19 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second the
20 motion.

21 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been
22 properly moved and seconded. All of those in favor
23 of the motion, signify by saying aye.

24 (All members of the board voted unanimously by

1 saying aye.)

2 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,
3 same sign.

4 Motion carries.

5 Thank you, Matt.

6 Last but not least, I'm going to
7 call on Laurie Gatton from the Precinct Election
8 Officials Department to discuss with us Poll Worker
9 Training Manuals.

10 MS. GATTON: Well, we're at the end.
11 That's good, right, for you guys. You guys had a
12 hard day today. So thanks for having me here. I'm
13 here to ask that you approve our -- it's that time
14 again, think about training our poll workers, and
15 we are going to need our manuals for that.

16 So we're asking for about 40,000,
17 little bit more, 370 dollars to purchase 4,500
18 manuals for our poll worker training.

19 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Perfect.

20 MEMBER FREEDHOFF: This is the same
21 printing company you used last year?

22 MS. GATTON: It is.

23 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Capital Square
24 Printing. I don't have any questions. Anyone

1 else?

2 MEMBER FREEDHOFF: I do not.

3 Mr. Chairman, Meredith Freedhoff, I
4 move the board approve the purchase of 4,500 Poll
5 Worker Training Manuals at the cost of \$40,370.

6 MEMBER SHUMAKER: Jamie Shumaker, I
7 second.

8 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been
9 properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of
10 the motion, signify by saying aye.

11 (All members of the board voted unanimously by
12 saying aye.)

13 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,
14 same sign.

15 Motion carries.

16 MS. GATTON: Thank you.

17 MEMBER FREEDHOFF: Thank you.

18 DIRECTOR WHITE: What else can we
19 talk about?

20 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Move to adjourn.

21 MEMBER FREEDHOFF: Second.

22 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Seeing no
23 objection, we're adjourned.

24 (Meeting was adjourned at 3:00 p.m.)
